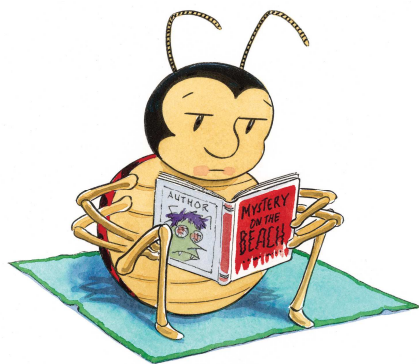

August 7: Local Teen Author

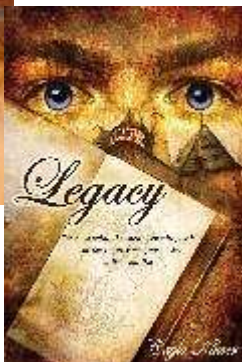
Listen: Cayla Kluver talks about her newly published book!

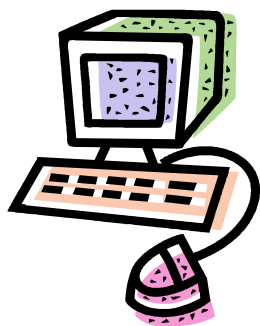
